Policy Proposal for

"Allowing opposite sex overnight guest privileges"

A RESOLUTION TO:

Advocate for the allowance of opposite sex overnight guests in the residence hall.

RATIONALE:

It is to the benefit and respectability of every residence hall student that this proposal is written. It is apparent that some residents have a concern about the current overnight guests' policy. This concern entails the restriction on opposite sex overnight visits. The fairness and validity of this policy has come into question because of the recent inclusivity of the LGBT community on campus. The current university policy for overnight guests' allows for all residents to have guests of the same sex. However, this policy excludes residents who desire to have any guest of the opposite sex, whether it be a family member or a friend stay in the Residence Hall overnight.

The overnight guest policy is rooted in religious understanding that purity is a law rather than a preference. The Catholic teachings and morals of Madonna are what make our University invaluable and stout with integrity. The Student Senate stands in solidarity with administration, faculty and staff to better prepare our students for a bright future. Yet we, the voice of the students, believe the overnight guest policy is outdated and unproductive to student independence and growth.

The Wellness Committee proposes that the overnight guest policy be extended to include opposite sex guests. A guest is a guest and there should be no discrimination between them. The committee finds this request to be both inclusive and reasonable for all residents. We take pride in our community. The Student Code of Conduct states that, "Madonna University strives to provide an inclusive, respectful, supportive, intellectual community we can all be proud of. In order to maximize each student's college experience and educational potential." Changing the current overnight guest policy to allow guests of the opposite sex would more accurately reflect this statement, as well as show respect and sensitivity for others and support open communication to enhance our living/learning atmosphere.

Like Madonna University, Hilbert College is also a member of the Association of Franciscan Colleges and Universities. The college is named after Mother Colette Hilbert, who, in 1897, established the Franciscan Sisters of St. Joseph, which became the college's founding congregation. In 1957, the community founded a teacher training college for its members; in 1969, having broadened its curriculum to include degrees outside of teacher training and expanded its enrolment to include both men and women, the institution officially became known as Hilbert College. Their mission: Hilbert College is an independent institution of higher learning that embraces its Catholic Franciscan heritage and values. Students from diverse backgrounds are educated in liberal arts and professional programs to become informed citizens committed to serving and strengthening their communities. Madonna and Hilbert are very similar in many

respects, but one notable difference is their guest policy. At Hilbert College, a guest is a guest; they do not differentiate or discriminate based upon the sex of the individual. Living in the 21st century, this ideology should be embraced. It is understood that Madonna's overnight guest policy is rooted in our religious beliefs and values, however it is time for change. This institution is both evolving and expanding, and this minor change could set a precedence for other things to follow suit in the future. A copy of Hilbert Colleges Guest/Visitation Policy, as well as both their Mission and Vision are attached.

There is also an attached excerpt from the Madonna University Student Handbook; Article 4, section 4G, which is the University Policy for Diversity and Inclusion. With the current overnight guest policy this excerpt can not be read whole heartedly nor enforced. Changing the policy to allow overnight guests of the opposite sex would allow for this statement to be undoubtedly true.

Madonna University Student Handbook ARTICLE 4. UNIVERSITY POLICIES 4G: Diversity and Inclusion

At Madonna University, the commitment to diversity and inclusion emanates from the Franciscan values of respect for the dignity of each person, concern for the disadvantaged and oppressed, and reverence for life, rather than as a response to external regulations.

Guest/Visitation Policy

A guest is defined as a person who is staying in a resident's room for an evening or weekend. An overnight guest must room with their host and they must be with their host at all times. The host is responsible for the behavior of their guest.

The resident host will sign in the guest at the residence hall front desk with a picture ID. If a visitor has a vehicle on campus, the visitor must put an overnight slip in the dashboard so campus safety is aware of the vehicle. A visitor must park in the lot behind McGrath Library.

A resident's room can have no more than two guests spending the evening and guest(s) may stay no longer than two consecutive nights during the week.

Visitors are allowed only 10 overnight visits per semester.

Under no circumstances will anyone under the age of 17 be permitted to stay as an overnight guest in the residence hall without written parental consent filed with the Office of Residence Life. Guests must provide valid photo ID with date of birth. This is to be done prior to arrival at the residence hall. All guests are responsible to follow the rules and regulations that are stated in both the Residence Life Handbook and the Student Handbook.

Any infraction by guests will result in immediate expulsion of the guests from the residence hall. A resident's privilege to have guests is subjected to the following limitations:

- A resident may not pressure or force roommates to tolerate the presence of a guest.
- A guest may not occupy a student's room when the student is not present (a resident may not give a guest a room key or college ID to enter the hall).
- At all times the resident must accompany the guest inside the residence hall.

Any visitor to the residence hall must sign in at the front desk with a valid form of ID. Failure to do so may result in judicial action against both the visitor and the host. Residents are responsible for their visitors and/or guests.
