Grant writing is a critical skill and process for individuals and organizations seeking financial support for various initiatives, research, or programs. Essential for non-profits, grant writing serves as a bridge between those with resources (grant makers) and those with needs or innovative ideas (grantees). This 16-week course prepares participants to:

1. Locate grant funds available from governmental and private entities.
2. Identify unmet needs and design projects that meet priorities of funding sources.
3. Describe ways to establish and maintain functional collaborative partnerships.
4. Explain the responsibilities of grant administration and grant fund reporting.
5. Prepare funding proposals that are responsive to funding agency requirements.
6. Develop and maintain fiscal and programmatic metrics for monitoring, program improvement, and reporting.
